# **Hunting and Roads**

As always, Haliburton Forest will be closed during the moose and deer hunts. Only members of approved hunt clubs will be permitted within the property. However, the property will be open between the moose and deer hunts. Following the conclusion of the deer hunt, roads within the property will be closed to vehicle traffic.

## Moose Hunt

**Property Closed:** Mon. October 21 – Sun. October 27

You must be off the property by 8PM on Sunday, October 20. You may return to the property after 8PM on Sunday, October 27.

# Between Hunts

**Property Open:** Mon. October 28 – Sun. November 3.

You may return to the property after 8PM on Sunday, October 27. You must be off the property by 8PM on Sunday, November 3.

# Deer Hunt

**Property Closed:** Mon. November 4 – Sun. November 17

You must be off the property by 8PM on Sunday, November 3. This is the last day for vehicle access. You may return to the property after 8PM on Sunday, November 17 (via ATV or Snowmobile only).

# **Leased Campsite Fee Structure**

Lessees have two options when it comes to deadlines for payments:

The first option is to pay in full by December 31, in order to "lock in" at last year's rate. If you did this already, thank you!


The second option is to make a deposit of \$1,000.00 by December 31 and pay the balance by 5PM on the Monday of the May Long Weekend.

Payments can be made online by e-transferring to accounting@haliburtonforest.com and including your name, lake and site number in the transfer notes.

You can also pay by cheque, cash, debit or credit.

Credit transaction can be processed over the phone or in person and are subject to a 3% service fee.

ATVs and Snowmobiles may be parked in the top fields starting Sunday, October 13, 2024. All items must be removed by end of the day on May 11, 2025.

No recreational powersports equipment or trailers are permitted in the bottom field (scrap metal area) or the Wild Woods Walk tree-line. The bottom field will be used for additional vehicle parking throughout the winter months.

Please note that Haliburton Forest is not responsible for the safety of your equipment when it is parked in these areas.

Season passes for ATVs and snowmobiles will be \$155.00 plus HST this year. Passes are purchased per machine for one specific individual and are valid from January 1, 2025—December 31, 2025.

As a friendly reminder, your guests are not covered under your passes. Just like in the summer, guests are not permitted to drive ATVS or snowmobiles on property until winter trails open to the public. Your guests can get a passenger pass and ride in with you that way. Once trails are open to the public, they will need their own pass to drive (or passenger pass if they are not driving) whether they borrow your machine or bring their own. Passes are per day, not per night.



# Firewood Availability

Please ensure a firewood cutting indemnification has been signed prior to operating a chainsaw on Haliburton Forest property. PPE must be worn, being steel-toed boots, chaps, helmet, ear protection, eye protection, and gloves.

Firewood is currently available to be cut at the following location: Owl Trail past Duck Lake Shelter Cabin.

Firewood is being sold at the Main Office in bags for \$10/bag. If you are looking for larger quantities, we recommend calling Nesbitt Firewood Sales (705 935 0950).
